We are a Catholic Coeducational Secondary College with two campuses, set on approximately 20 hectares of beautiful gardens and playing fields. MacKillop is a college in the Josephite tradition, inspired by the spirit of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop; we invite passionate engagement in lifelong and authentic learning, respect diversity and support every person in the pursuit of excellence.

MacKillop is an innovative learning community offering contemporary facilities, a vibrant curriculum and supportive wellbeing programs that are respectful and responsive to the individual needs of approximately 1,730 students from Years 7-12.

About the role

We have two positions, 1 X Fulltime ongoing, and 1 X Fixed Term Fulltime (Term 1 only).

MacKillop College invites experienced educators seeking a leadership position within Learning Diversity.

This role will collaborate with our educators to design, implement and evaluate learning programs to ensure they meet the needs of students with an identified need. The Learning Diversity Leader, in consultation with the Directors' of Learning Diversity, will build the capacity of educators to differentiate learning; implement Individualised Learning Plans and; help in the development and implementation of differentiated learning resources.

To be successful in the role you will need a contemporary understanding of pedagogical practices for a differentiated curriculum and have an ability to proactively advocate for suitable interventions and resources for students with a learning diversity need.

At MacKillop College we are committed to innovation and working collaboratively. Our teachers enjoy the benefit of a welcoming and supportive culture, contemporary teaching facilities and professional support which includes, a team of dedicated instructional coaches, teacher mentors, and a variety of skills development opportunities. As a Catholic College, our teachers must have an active commitment to working in and supporting a school culture that reflects gospel values and a pastoral approach towards student and staff wellbeing.

The successful applicants will commence Term 1, 2025 and be allocated a position of leadership allowance (POL 3) plus generous time release (550 minutes). Positions of leadership are allocated until January 2027.

- demonstrated experience in developing, implementing and evaluating a differentiated curriculum
- an ability to cultivate respectful relationships between students, staff and families
- a demonstrated ability to foster a welcoming and calm learning environment that promotes positive behaviour
- experience working with a range of learning diversity needs and diagnoses
- excellent communication skills with a recognised ability to build authentic relationships
