
ONE SCHOOL - THREE CAMPUSES


The new campus at Wyndham Vale provides Mackillop College with a unique opportunity to create a new Catholic Education Precinct in the Western Suburbs.


The Master Planning of the new campus should not be considered in isolation. Instead, it should be developed to compliment and augment existing facilities at the two existing campuses of MacKillop College.

Working together the cluster of campuses enable the school to strategically develop specializations at each site, maximizing value, reducing duplication and offering a unified yet diverse Catholic Education.

Students will have the chance to travel between campuses, ensuring that everyone enjoys the full breadth of the MacKillop experience.







The Wyndham Vale site is located on the lands of the Wadawurrung People, the traditional owners. Planning reports indicate an area of Aboriginal Cultural Heritage located in the north western part of the site.

The site is covered in Plains Grassland, listed as having an endangered Bioregional Conversation Status. A few established eucalyptus trees are present near the centre of the site. The site has been rezoned into an Urban Growth Zone and is part of the emerging Jubilee Estate in the Scholars Green neighbourhood. The south eastern part of the site is zoned as a Designated Bushfire Prone Area.

CONNECTIONS The proposed school zones have been arranged to connect into their context. The proposed ELC is located near the Town Centre, the Primary & Secondary schools are centered in the site and the large school oval is adjacent to the future council sporting fields.






The MacKillop College Werribee Campus is located on the original school grounds first established in 1970 as a girls secondary college. Over the years the school has expanded to enable it to offer quality Catholic education to more students.

The campus is the largest in size of the three school sites and caters to Year 7-12 students. The students are offered a comprehensive and well balanced curriculum with a broad range of units in VCE and VET. There are quality established teaching spaces for specialist subjects focusing on Design & Technology as well as a large theatre and stage for Performing Arts.









2 WERRIBEE SOUTH CAMPUS

St Mary's Campus in Werribee South is a purpose built Year 9 Campus that allows students to spend 6 months of the year learning in an alternative setting. The curriculum focuses on learning through experience, engaging in meaningful community actions and inquiry based learning.

In the future, the St Mary's Campus curriculum will be offered to students from both the Werribee and Wyndham Vale Campuses to promote collaboration, interaction and fostering relationships between students.

The proposed new Wyndham Vale Campus offers the opportunity to expand the MacKillop Cluster and create a campus with quality, flexible & vibrant learning spaces, a careful and considered integration of nature and landscape to fosters a sense of community and belonging.

There will be a focus on providing high quality specialist facilities to teach Food Technology & Hospitality to compliment the offerings at the Werribee Campus.

Additionally a two court competition sized indoor Basketball and Netball Stadium will be developed adjacent to the community sports fields, providing Physical Education, Health, Sport and Recreation educational opportunities for MacKillop College students and the broader community alike.

CATHOLIC IDENTITY

MacKillop College is named in honor of Australia's first and only saint, St Mary MacKillop, founder of the Sisters of St Joseph ite educational institution, the College's identity centres on a holistic integration of faith and learning. The new Wyndham Vale Campus will embody Catholic identity through architectural and landscape design, thoughtfully integrating Josephite values within its simple functional design, economic, low maintenance and durable material choices, incorporating natural light and addressing environmental context.

SITE

The site is currently covered in plains grassland and has several established eucalyptus trees which will be retained to form the central environmental avenue.

This landscape-led approach fosters a natural aesthetic, enhancing students' environmental awareness and cultivating a sense of stewardship.

THE JOSEPHITES

The Josephite emblem, central to MacKillop College's Catholic identity, inspires the Master Plan layout.

The emblem celebrates the College's commitment to a warm and welcoming environment which strives to encourage creative courage, mutual respect, conscious compassion and intentional


The geometric form overlaid on the site provides the basic structure of the Master Plan and defines zones of use for the sub-schools, play spaces and outdoor learning areas.

MASTER PLAN CONCEPT


The Josephite pathways form the central concept at the heart of the master plan The pathways provide a simple plan form around which the new facilities are planned. References to Josephite values will be located at the intersections of the pathway.

This design reinforces the emblem's symbolic meaning, guiding movement through key areas and fostering connection, accessibility and a sense of belonging reflecting Josephite values.




TREE OF LIFE

Sculptures of prominent Josephite figures positioned at key nodes, where pathways intersect, referencing the three J's of the Josephite Emblem.



PEDESTRIAN PATHWAYS

Pedestrian pathways follow the A & M of Ave Maria, forming the basis of the circulation routes for the master plan solution.

The concrete will be inscribed with scripture along the route, a physical reference to the Catholic faith journey.

These robust materials ensure longevity and stability, while a calm natural color palette with a focus on the School's colours creates a harmonious relationship between the built environment and nature.

Thoughtful use of light creates uplifting, reflective spaces that foster a sense of peace. Natural light enhances mood, promoting warmth and openness while inviting contemplation.


Strategically placed windows and light-enhancing materials that interplay with light and shade can encourage introspection and personal growth.


ENVIRONMENT

CHAPEL

The Chapel is located with a prominent street address, at the welcoming main entry forecourt to the school. Primary and secondary school reception areas are easily identifiable from the forecourt and are centered around the Tree of Life demonstrating the School's Catholic Identity.




WELLBEING CENTRE



ENTRY FORECOURT

The main school entry is arranged around a public forecourt. A hierarchy of spaces, designed to take visitors from public, through private to privileged areas of the school. All spaces are flexible to allow for administration to function as facilities are rolled out across stages and the school population grows.

CHAPEL

Front and centre at the entry point to demonstrate Catholic Identity

PRAYER GARDEN

Existing trees to be incorporated into garden. Sculptures and seating to provide space for quiet reflection

SOLAR POWERED BIKE SHEDS

Solar panels form the roof top of covered ways and bike sheds, generating power for the school and reducing reliance on fossil fuel consumption.

DRY RIVER BED

Collects rainwater from rooftops and naturally filters it prior to discharge into the urban infrastructure

REFLECTION POND

Dry river beds and sculptural elements bring water through the site.

Pope Francis' 2015 encyclical underscores the moral imperative for urgent action on climate change. The central axis created by the Josephite Pathways, defines the primary and secondary school zones with an avenue dedicated to the environment.

It demonstrates to the school community how the environment should be respected, cultivated and celebrated.

WATER

Rainwater is harvested from the covered way rooftops and fed into a dry river bed. This filters the storm water prior to it being discharged into the street infrastructure.

AVENU

ENVIRONMENTAL


Water travels through the site to a reflection pond at the end of the avenue. This is a quiet contemplative space with a sculpture at its centre.

Excess rainwater is harvested to provide irrigation to the ovals and garden beds, and water for flushing toilets.

SHELTER

The avenue provides shelter from the rain and sun via covered ways. These provide spaces for passive recreation and gathering.

Corridors of planting across the site allow space for large trees to mature. These will provide natural shelter from the sun during the hot summer months, and habitat for bird life, native animals and insects






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PRINCIPLES OF DESIGN

All spaces to be designed for maximum flexibility to allow for curriculum to be delivered as facilities are rolled out across stages.

Primary learning spaces are single storey facilities of domestic scale in sympathy with the surrounding residential development. This is the most economical building typology and allows for excellent access to outdoor learning environment directly from indoor teaching spaces. Secondary facilities are two storey, to ensure that adequate open space is available. The vertical spaces provide opportunity for cohort hub spaces and linking support spaces.



Design to be simple and modular to ensure economies of scale. Consistent systems to be employed to ensure ease of transition between campuses and to reduce costs associated with maintenance contracts. Lessons learned from existing facilities to inform the design of the new campus

Multi-level buildings to be linked with vertical transport, amenity and staff spaces in the shared areas. This will reduce the number of lifts required on site, reducing cost and providing equitable access for all.
